





Vowel sounds

In English, vowels (a, e, i, o, and u) and combinations of vowels (e.g. ee, ai) can be pronounced in different ways. Sometimes they are short sounds, e.g. it = /it/, but sometimes they are long sounds, e.g. he = /hit/, or dipthongs (a combination of two vowel sounds, e.g. hi = /hai/).

The /ə/ sound is the most common vowel sound in English. The /ə/ sound has many different spellings, e.g. <u>pa</u>sta, <u>Sa</u>turday, <u>Bri</u>tain.




