

# How to Get Started in Magazines

Magazines offer opportunities for journalists at all levels of experience. So how do you get published? The first question to ask yourself is: "What is my area of expertise?" It is best to begin with a hobby, or something that interests you. Perhaps you know a particular craft, such as painting or woodworking. Maybe you're interested in technology. Think about the areas in which you have special knowledge. Find magazines that publish in-depth material about those areas.

Then, decide what kind of article you are going to write. Will it be an instructional piece, like a how-to, or a longer feature? Maybe a short story? Once you decide, collect clips from the magazine to understand the style it uses. After you find a good magazine for your writing, check the author guidelines. Each magazine has different requirements. Keep your article brief when submitting to the publisher. You can always expand it if the magazine likes your work.
